

## How to care for your Ivy Kissing Ball:



1. Place your Ivy Kissing Ball indoors in a bright location that does not receive full afternoon sun. It may also be placed outdoors in a protected patio or porch as long as it does not receive full afternoon sun. Move your Kissing Ball indoors if temperatures fall below freezing.
2. Water once your Ivy Kissing Ball is quite dry; do not allow the moss to remain soggy. The moss holds a lot of water, but under hot or dry conditions it may dry out rapidly.
3. The best way to water your Kissing Ball is to rinse it under a faucet or hose repeatedly until it is evenly moist, then let it drain in the sink or somewhere else that the draining water won't damage furniture or floor.
4. Misting the vines and leaves, especially on the upper half of the Kissing Ball with water in between watering is also beneficial to keeping your plant looking good and preventing insect pests.
5. Fertilize lightly with a complete fertilizer once a month if your plant is actively growing.
6. Trim off unwanted or excessive growth or pin vines to the ball to cover undesired open areas.
