

How to care for your Mossed Ivy Topiary:

If at all possible, keep the mossed items evenly moist without letting them remain soggy. The moss holds a lot of water, but under hot or dry conditions it may dry out rapidly. For the Mossed Topiaries without a pot of soil the best way to water the plants is to rinse the Topiary under a faucet or hose repeatedly until it is evenly moist, then let it drain in the sink or somewhere else that the draining water won't damage the furniture or floor. Make sure to find where the ivy plant(s) originates from in the body of the shape and concentrate the irrigation there. For the Mossed Topiaries with a pot, simply water the soil in the pot as you would any other plant, without letting it sit in a pool of water as Ivy is very sensitive to this. Sprinkling the vines and leaves a little is also beneficial to keeping the plant looking good. Fertilize judiciously periodically to keep the plant green and healthy. If the moss is allowed to remain soggy too long or too often leaf and root diseases will develop. Allow the Mossed Topiary to get slightly dry before watering. The act of rinsing or sprinkling the leaves regularly helps to keep them clean, green and free of insects.
